
A moonlit beach and a quiet stream are traced in the memory of the night. A walk into the galley of a ship provided special refreshments. We danced to the music of Magnum.


Pulaski edged Seymour in the football game 26-21. Firecrackers, pom pon girls and a good performance by the band added to the evening.

The Seymour Indian record-setting thinclads completed the '80 campaign with six representatives at the State Championships in Madison. None of the entries placed in Class "A" participation.

Dan Patza equaled his best with a 6'4" high jump effort. Sprinters John Doepker and John Winkler ran 23.5 and 51.5 in the 200 and 400 meter dashes. The 800 meter relay squad of Bogenschutz, Coel, Reed, and Doepker clocked a 1:32.5 time.

Along the way, outdoor school records were reset. Outdoor records include Keith Pingel-triple jump 41'7", Dan Patza-high jump 6'4" and 300 meter low hurdles 41.5; Dan Burke-9:48.8-3200 meter run and 4:32.8 1600 meter run; Jeff Bogenschutz-1:56.9 800 meter run; 800 meter relay-3:28.1 (Bogenschutz, Reed, Coel, Doepker); and the 1600 meter relay-3:28.1 (Marcks, Coel, Bogenschutz, Winkler).

The final game of the season was a 9-6 loss to Ashwaubenon.

Arlouine Bain was voted the MVP Award. She compiled a 5-6 record on the mound and had the team's highest batting average at .353. Jennie Huettl was awarded the Batting Crown and led the team in RBI's with 22. Lisa Haas and Mary Trotter shared the Glove Award for outstanding defense. Haas was an infielder while Trotter managed the catching duties.

The Indians had a strong offensive attack which enabled them to get an early lead in most games but inconsistancy on defense allowed the opponents to catch up in the late innings. 



Tackle Rick Hopfensperger, linebacker Joel Shultz, middle guard Bruce Nagel, and safety Terry Witthun were named to the second








