## Some Enchanted Evening . . .



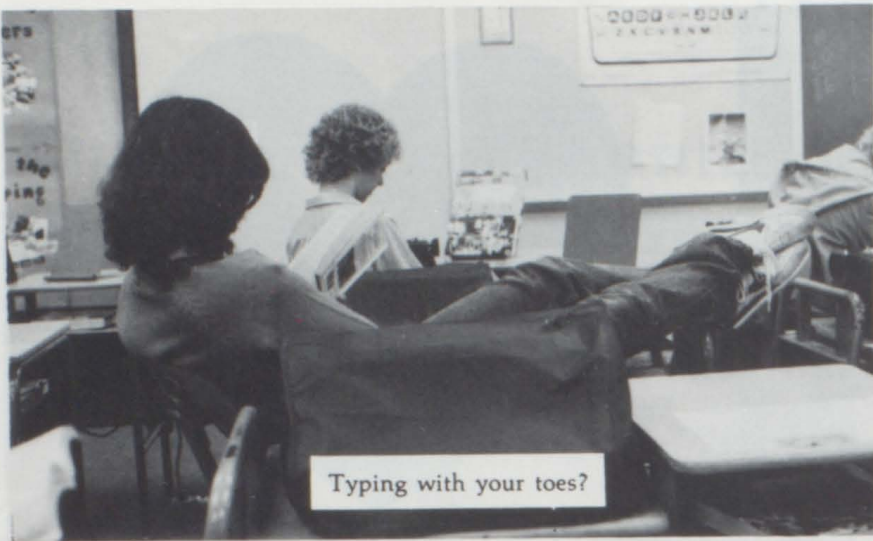

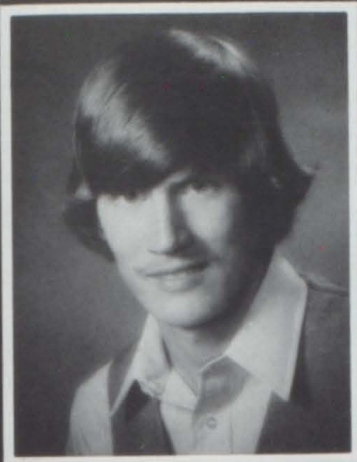


### Facing Graduation

I'm supposed to grow up and have a wonderful life. I haven't lived yet. I can't be dead.
