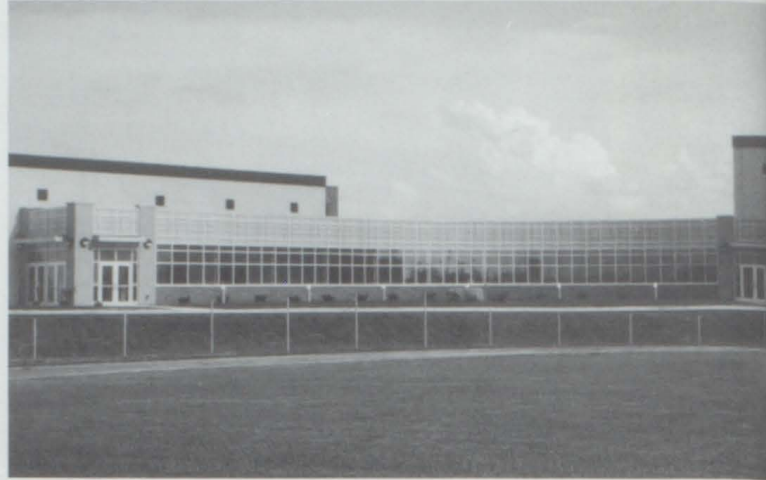


# SHS NOW AND THEN

Violin Class - was one of the music classes in 1922.



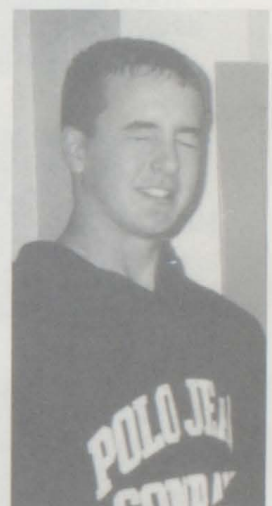
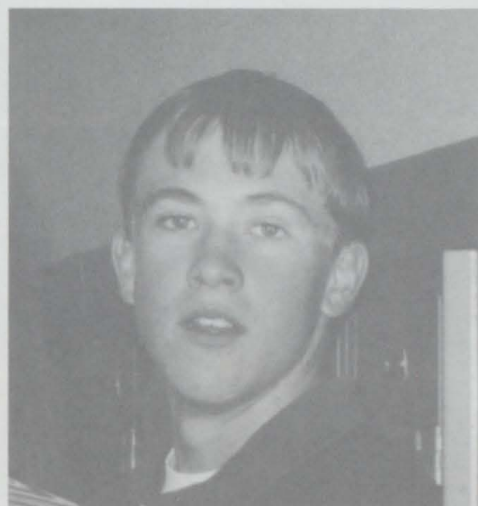
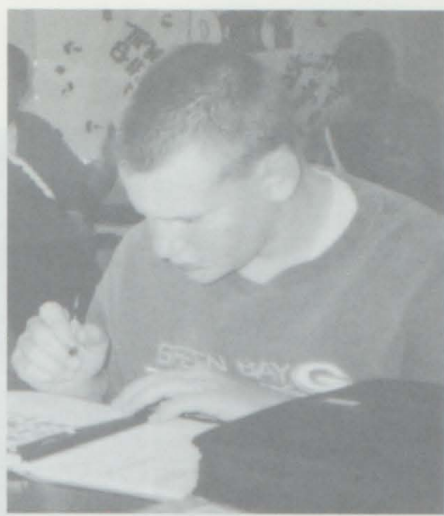

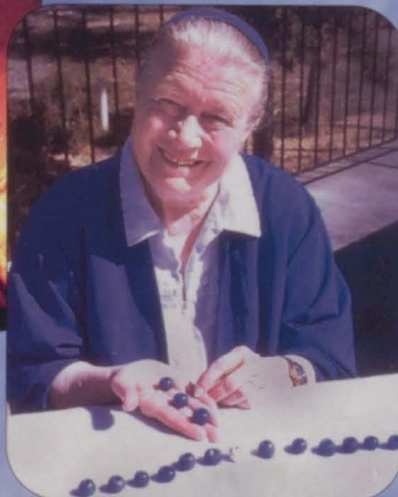

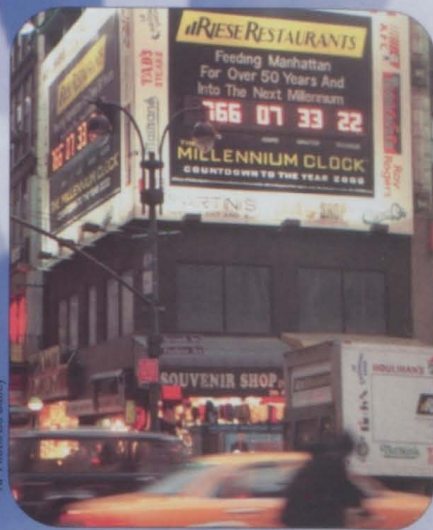

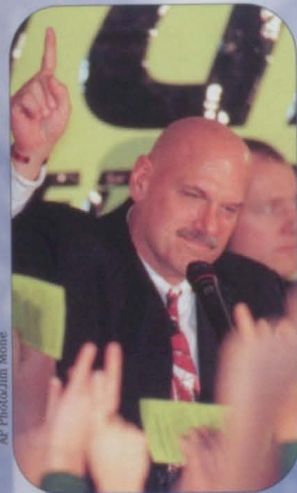

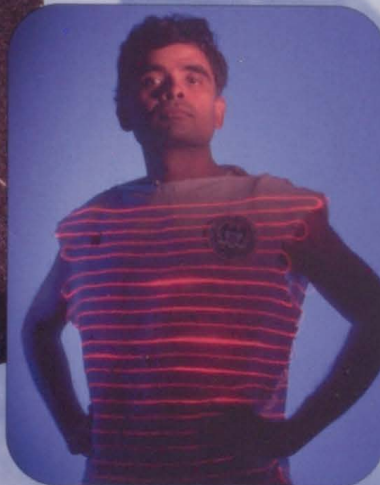

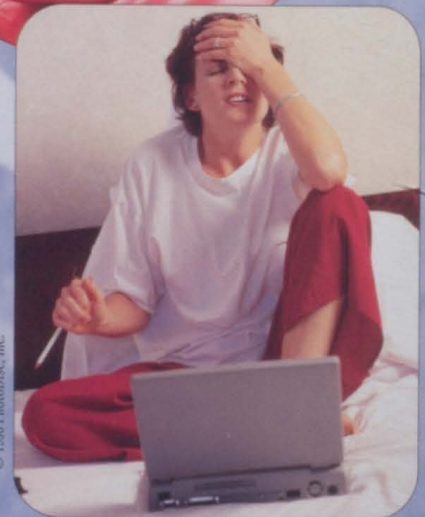

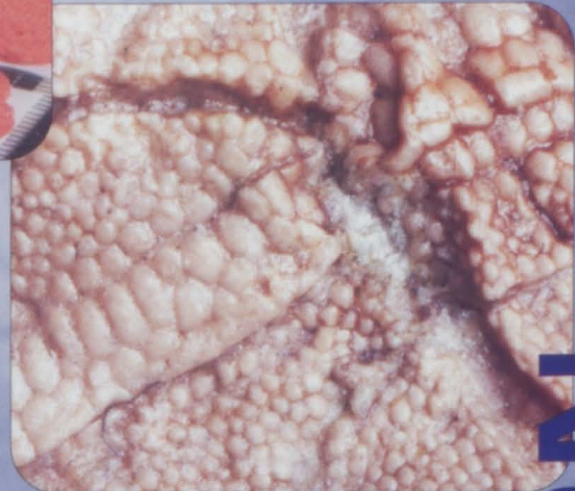

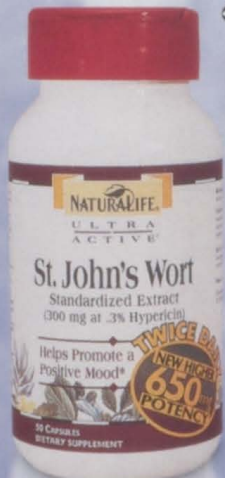

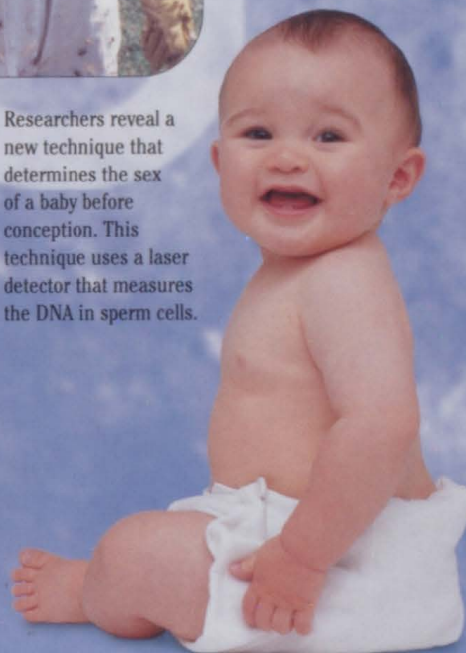

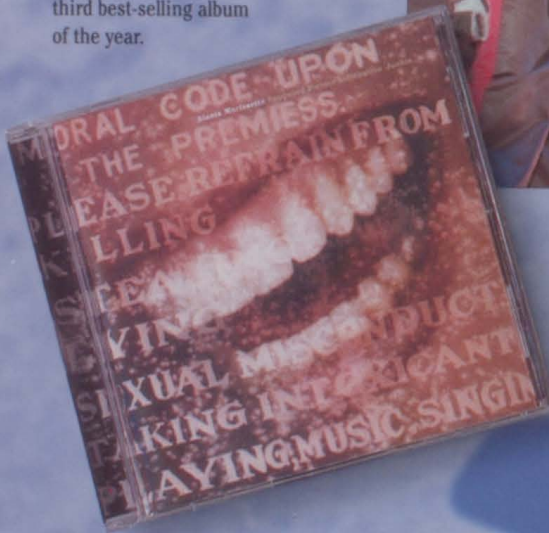

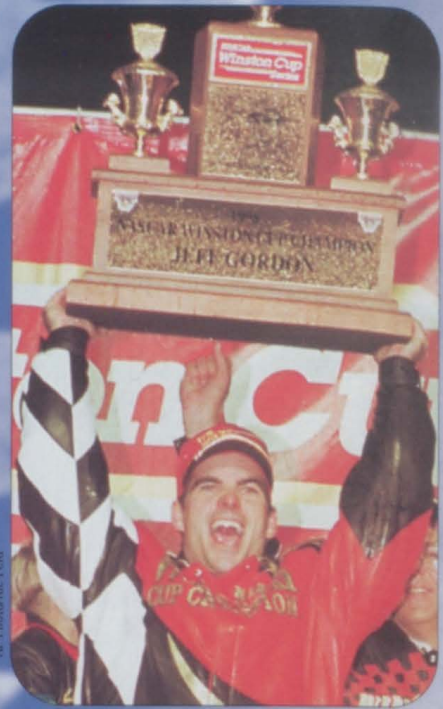

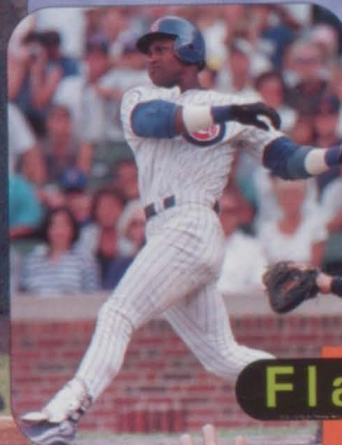

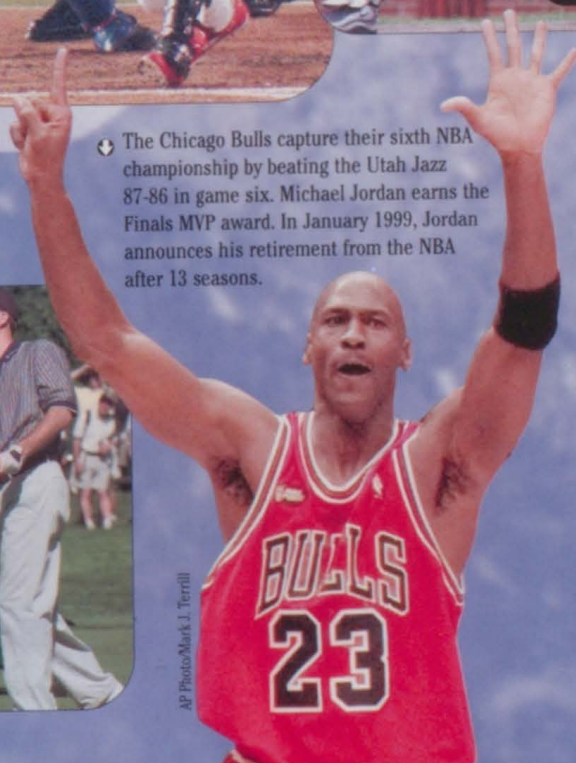
