The COVID-19 virus has changed our lives in ways we would never have expected last February. We have had to make adjustments to almost every aspect of our daily routines. I am Important Dates to Remember proud of all the families and school staff who have continued to be flexible and continue forward in these challenging times. August 1 - High School In May, we had more than 700 families respond to a survey to help us gather information on Graduation digital learning plan, communication or meals. Here are a few of the results that we received: September 1 - First Day of 53% of respondents felt their child was engaged and could do most of the work on their own, School 43% felt their child was engaged but needed family support to complete it. 79% felt the workload was appropriate for their child 85% felt the communication by the district was beneficial eumout 85% felt the meals were high quality 99% felt the meal sites were efficient and locations were accessible. under In June we had more than 1000 people respond to a follow up parent survey to gather information related to the opening of next school year. As of this publication we have some initial results. Here is a summary of some of those results: Connect with Us! About 70% of respondents prefer an in-person school setting with 24% a blended or hybrid setting. About • 5% preferred remote or virtual learning only. 50% of respondents were comfortable with having their child attend with minimal concerns, while about Facebook 45% still had some concerns. **Seymour Community School** 80% of respondents said they would be sending their child if an in-person setting was the instructional District model, with only 1% saying they would not send their child. 19% were still uncertain. We will also Phone continue to look for feedback from our staff, parents and this community as we finalize plans for next year. While we 920-833-2304 understand that many families want to know what the school schedule will look like next year, we want to be flexible so that we can meet whatever our local health departments guidance is. We will use this information as we continue to plan for the upcoming school year. Over the summer we will be planning for the reopening of schools in September. We have a team that will be working over the summer to plan for a variety of situations that may occur as students come back to school. I hope everyone has a great summer! Keep your child engaged with learning this summer! Check out the online resources shown on the left side of the "Students &

Parents" page on our district website. These resources include free online books and games to engage your child all summer. Find ways to infuse learning throughout your summer. Ideas include:

- Read every day! Students who read regularly during the summer maintain or increase their reading skills. Along with books, be creative with what you have your child read- joke books, graphic novels, sports statistics, magazines, recipes, movie reviews, and more! Audiobooks are great too as they encourage listening skills and the learning of new vocabulary.
- 2. Use Math every day! Involve your child in cooking with you to learn measurements. Have your child make change. Play online math games. Practice counting out loud together. Make up math word problems for your child to solve. Have your child keep score during a game.
- 3. **Get outside & play!** Physical activity is good for the body & brain! Find fun ways to get active like family bike rides, creating a home obstacle course, walking the dog, finding a fun exercise or yoga video online.
- 4. Write every week! Ask your child to write a weekly letter to his or her grandparents, relatives, or friends, keep a summer journal, write the family's grocery list. Create a family summer scrapbook with your child writing the labels and descriptions for the pictures.
- 5. Do a good deed! Students learn and feel better when they engage in activities to aid in their social-emotional development, such as community service. Encourage your child to surprise neighbors or friends by helping them with a job. Pick up garbage in your neighborhood. Have your child clean their room or play area and then donate unwanted items to a charity.

a moment to ask my staff for some feedback regarding their virtual teaching experiences and what I learned was that our Pupil Services/Special Education staff are truly the BEST OF THE BEST!!! Below are some quotes as well as some informational tips from our devoted staff:

"When this began I created 'traveling classrooms' that contained a daily schedule and work for each of my students. I created hands-on activities for each of my students as well as the supplies needed to complete their work. My staff helped me assemble all of the boxes. I dropped off the 'traveling classrooms' at each of my students' homes.

Weekly, I meet with students individually and in small groups by way of google meet. We work on IEP goals, and we spend time sharing our stories.....

I use Screencastify to video record myself reading books to them and then I send them to their email. Parents are saving them to play for their students throughout the summer too. One of my parents video-taped her child watching me read to him....


I communicate with parents weekly, some of them daily. Some parents send me photos of their students as well as their student's work....

This week I created a google slideshow telling my students how much I miss them. I added multiple photos of all of my students to the tune of "You've Got a Friend in Me" and shared it with all of them.

The highlight of this week were the signs my students made for teacher appreciation week. They shared them with me virtually while on Google Meet...so sweet".

"Something inspiring that I have witnessed during virtual learning is seeing how the kids have been advocating for themselves. We work to improve advocacy and communication (both written & verbal) skills daily in 8th grade. It has been fun to get emails from students asking for help or simply requesting a Google Hangout to chat. It does my heart good knowing we make a difference helping students become their best selves!"

#### Academic Career Planning replaces Homeroom in the High School

Next year, all high school students will continue to learn how their skills and interests shape their future plans in a

class called "Academic Career Planning" (ACP).

In this class, students will:

- Understand their own interests, strengths, values, learning styles
- Understand the variety of post-high school pathways
- Create a vision of their future
- Develop realistic individual goals
- Prepare a personal plan for achieving their vision and goals
- Develop skills relevant to obtaining and maintaining employment

The ACP class will meet the first five days of each quarter in addition to one day the following month during ELT time. This is taking the place of Homeroom. Students will earn .25 credit per year; it is a pass/fail course. All students assigned to an Academic Career Planning class are required to attend school until 3:05 p.m., regardless of Gold Card status. Here are the dates for the 2020-21 School-year:




