## Seymour Middle School $7^{\text {th }}$ Grade Football Study Guide

## Terms:

1. Downs- In class you have four downs to get a first down and four downs to score a touchdown. In college, professional, and high school football you have four downs to get ten yards.
2. Defense- The team without possession of the ball.
3. End Zone- The area at either end of the field, beyond the goal line. A pass caught in the end zone is a touchdown.
4. Fumble- Dropping the ball while holding it.
5. Hand off- Giving the ball to a player on your team.
6. Holding- Holding on to an opponent with your hands. (5 or 10 yard penalty)
7. Goal Posts- The posts outside the end zone on both sides of the field.
8. Red Zone- The twenty yards closest to the end zone a team is scoring at.
9. Interception- A forward pass caught by a defender.
10. Line of Scrimmage- An imaginary line formed by the nose of the ball. (The line runs from sideline to sideline)
11.Offense- The team with possession of the ball.
12.Off-sides- Being over the line of scrimmage when the ball is centered.
11. Kick-Off- Used to start the game, at the start of the second half, and after a touchdown/point after attempt.
12. Blocking- A method of keeping the defense from getting to the player with the ball.
13. Incomplete Pass- A forward pass that is not caught.
14. Shotgun- When the quarterback stands about five yards behind the center. A long snap is used.
15. Punt- Dropping the ball and kicking it before it touches the ground.
16. Centering- A method of putting the ball in play. Done by the offensive center.
19.Sack- Tackling the quarterback behind the line of scrimmage.
17. Faircatch- A player may make a faircatch on a kickoff or punt by raising and waiving his/her hand above his/her head before making the catch. He or she may not run with the ball or be tackled after they make the catch.
21.Pass Interference- When someone is trying to catch a pass, the person cannot be bumped, pushed, or touched. This is a $\mathbf{1 5}$ yard penalty.

1. Fly
2. Down and Out
3. Down and In
4. Flag
5. Post

## Scoring:

In professional, college, and high school football there are four ways to score.

1. Touchdown- (6points)

A touchdown is scored when a person crosses his/her team's goal line with the ball, or catches a pass while in the end zone.
2. Point After Touchdown (P.A.T.)- Also known as the extra point.

A P.A.T. is the play after a touchdown is scored and occurs from the three yard line.
a. If the team passes or runs the ball in they get $\mathbf{2}$ points.
b. If the ball is kicked through the goal post you get one point.
3. Field Goal- ( 3 points)

A field goal is worth three points and is awarded when the offensive team kicks the ball through the goal posts.
4. Safety- (2 points)

A safety is scored when the offensive team is tackled in their own end zone.

Player Positions: Offense:

> Running Back Running Back

Wide Receiver Tight End Tackle Guard Center Guard Tackle Wide Receiver

Running Backs- Main job is to run with the ball. Do some pass catching and blocking.

Quarterback- Start every play, hand the ball off, run, or throw a pass.
Wide Receivers- Main job is to catch passes but also do some blocking.
Tight End- Block and catch some passes.
Tackles and Guards- Main job is to block.
Center- center the ball to the quarterback and block.

Defense:

Line Backer

Corner Backs \& Safetys- cover wide receivers and tight end help out with tackling.

Line Backers- cover running backs and make most of the tackles.
Nose Guard- take on the center and try to make tackles up the middle, and try and sack the quarterback on pass plays.

Defensive Tackles- take on the offensive tackles and try to make tackles in the middle, also try and sack the quarterback on pass plays.

Defensive Ends- Try to keep the running backs from carrying the ball outside and help in making tackles and sacking the quarterback.
