Hours needed to receive Community Service Honor Cords:

- Students graduating in 2014 or later = 120 hours
- Students graduating in 2013 = 90 hours

♥ Only ¼ of your community service hours may be earned during the hours of the school

day (Mon., Tue., Wed., Thur., Fri., 8:00am - 3:00pm)

Community Service hours should be recorded and submitted within 30 days of completion of the project/work. There is a drop box in the main office of the high school. The person supervising your activity must sign the form. (This should not be a parent or relative.) See Ms. Mikulski or Mrs. Gawryleski for questions.
