 Life was very hard for her mom when she was living in a war torn country. List four traumatic things her mom experienced or witnessed. – p 24 - 26

- 5. List two adjectives (descriptive words) to describe her mother who left China and the kind of person she is.
  - 6. Re- read the final paragraphs on p 26. Use inference skills to explain what happened to the babies.
  - 7. How might Jing-Mae's (the narrator/daughter) perception of her mother have changed when she hears the real ending of the story? Why?
  - 8. How might Jing-Mae's mother's experiences in China shape her new life in America (think about how it may have affected her parenting).
  - 9. Explain the significance of the title. What was The Joy Luck club? AND why do you think they selected THAT name?
  - 10. What **point of view** is this story told? First person or third person?
