
Making a Works Cited Page



Tips

Click on MLA

You make a Works Cited entry for each resource you'll think you'll use.

Once you've filled out each box the best you can, click SUBMIT and your citation will be processed for you. Copy and paste that into an email and send it to whoever is making the master works cited page.

Whoever makes the master works cited page must put them in

- <u>alphabetical order</u> (based on the first word of the entry)
- <u>indent the 2nd line (or more) of each entry (if there is a 2nd line)</u>
- <u>double space</u>
- <u>label it Works Cited or Work Cited (if there is only one source)</u> -- <u>NOT sources,</u> <u>bibliography, etc.</u>
