But seriously, some really sweet and groovy music was heard the night they played for the dance after the basketball game. Here's hoping this is an organization that will remain at SHS from here on out!

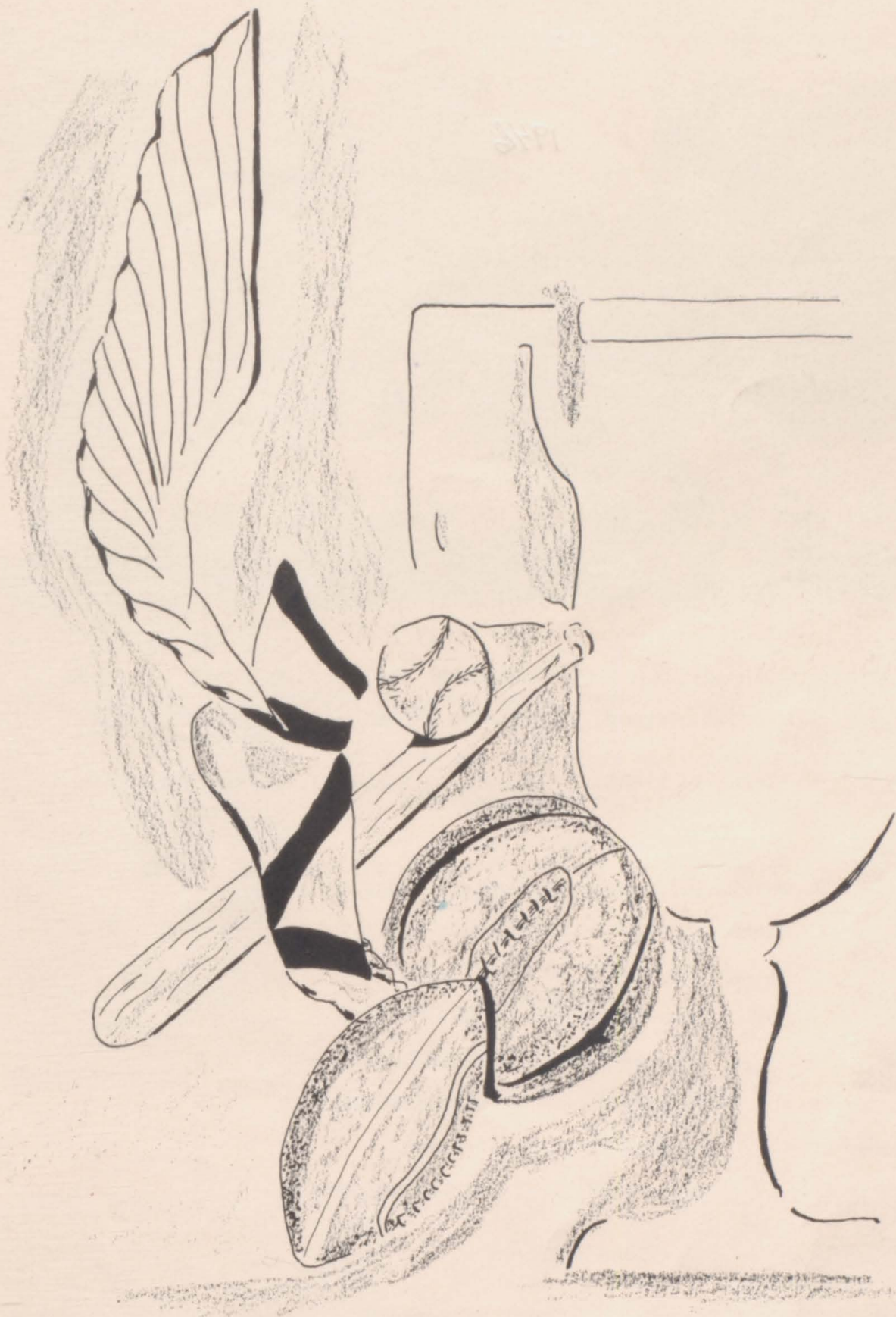

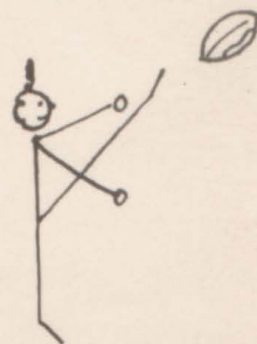
