Seymour's football season wasn't too great, considering the games won and lost, but when the statistics came out, they showed that the Indians had outplayed most of their opponents. When the season closed and the all-conference selections were made, Seymour landed Bob Rohloff, Vic Hein, and LeRoy Ciesielczyk on the first eleven, with Don Wickesberg gaining a second team berth.

Don Wickesberg was named captain for the year as the annual football banquet closed the season of 1949. The senior players were honored at a banquet at the Shawano County Club along with five other schools.

The Indians dropped their opening game to the Cherry-Pickers of Sturgeon Bay 30-7. Playing host to Kiel, Rohloff and Johns combined to defeat the visitors 21-0. Against the Papermakers of Kimberly we outplayed them but still took a 20-0 loss. Playing a team that hadn't been beaten for two years,
 the Indians rallied to dump the Omro "11" 20-7. A lucky break gave the Pulaski Raiders a $7-0$ decision. The annual Homecoming against Bonduel was a heartbreaking 25-20 loss in the final three minutes. Playing at Minahan Stadium against the West De Pere Phantoms, Rohloff piled up close to 200 yards, but they licked us $25-13$. The season closed with the Oconto Blue Devils taking a 7-0 win over the Indians.

## B A S K E T B A L L

With 8 lettermen returning, Seymour had a successful basketball season, winning 18, losing 5. The Indians took first place in the Mid-Valley Conference and ended in second place in the Little Nine. The Indians' two games with Kimberly were the highlights of the basketball season, the games being played at the Appleton gymnasium. Over flow crowds attended both games. Seymour lost the first game 49-38, and dropped the second game by a 38-27 count in the final 25 seconds after leading the entire game. The Indians scored a total of 1,100 points to their opponents 843.
