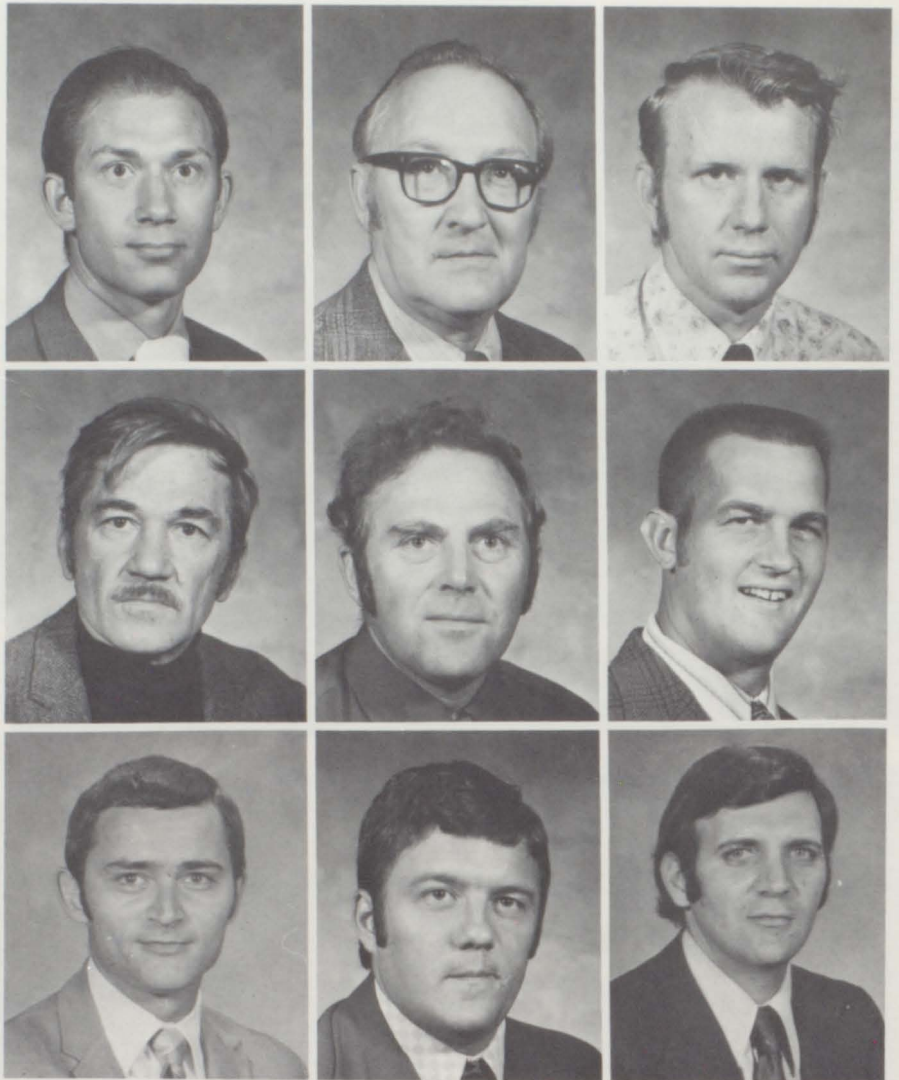
# New Faces, New Rules, And New Classes

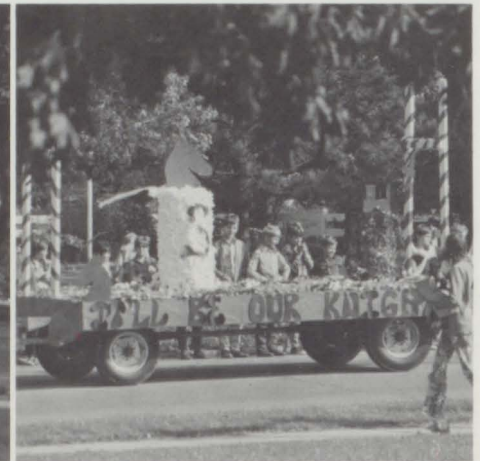


This year's Homecoming was a huge success compared with the 1972 Homecoming.

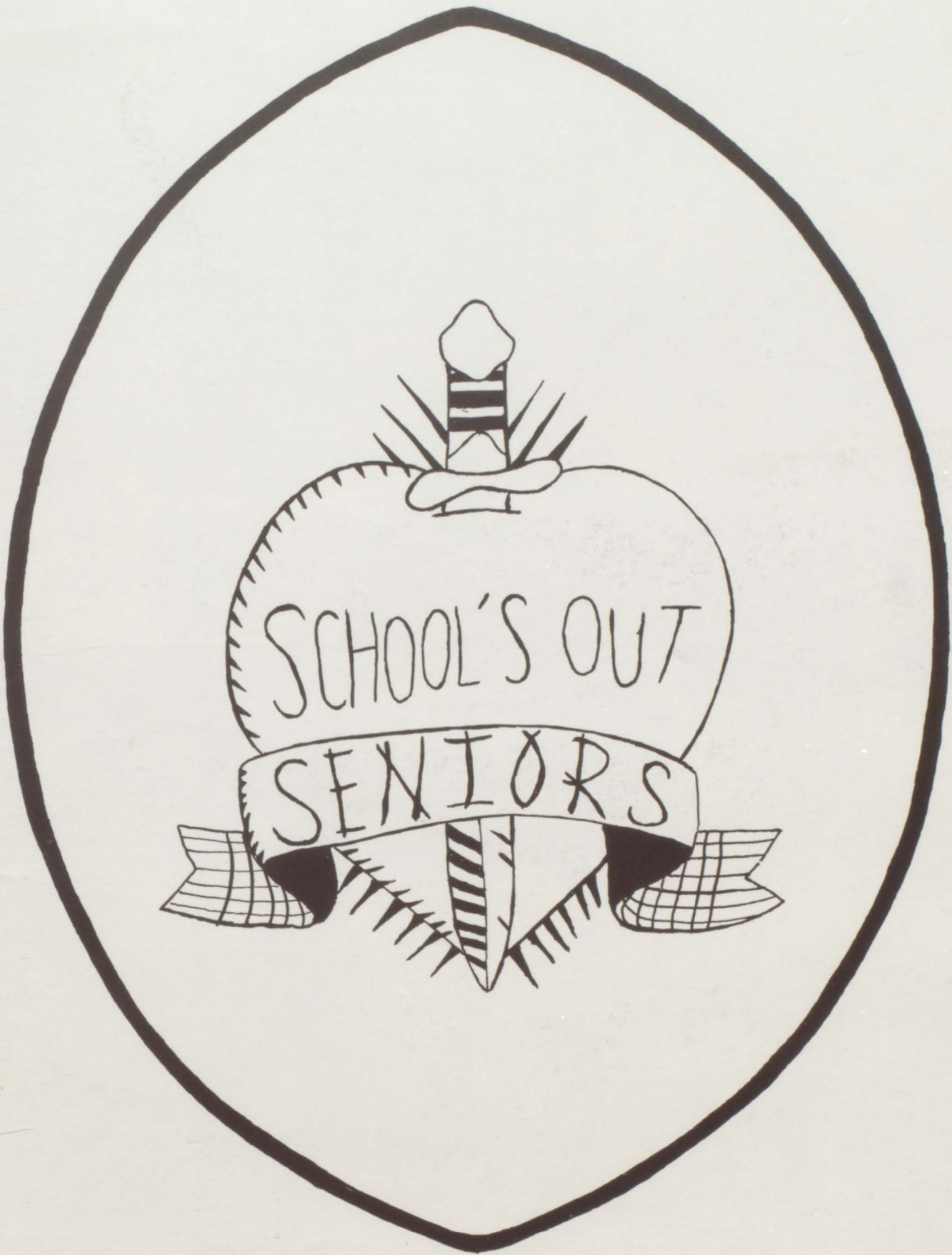

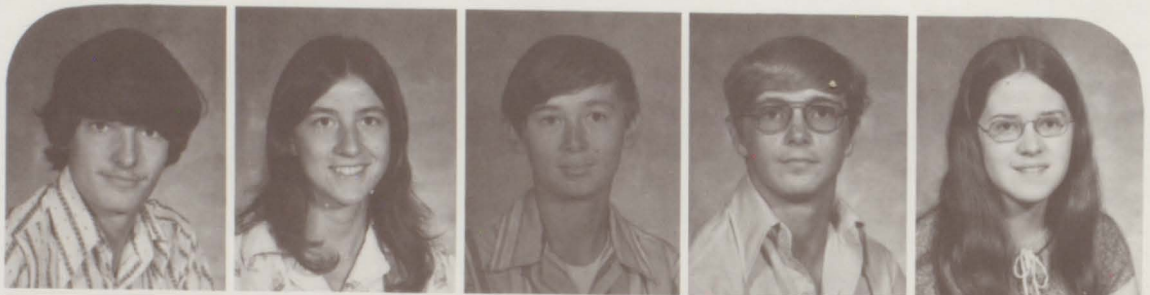
# We Follow Today — Just Wait 'til Tomorrow

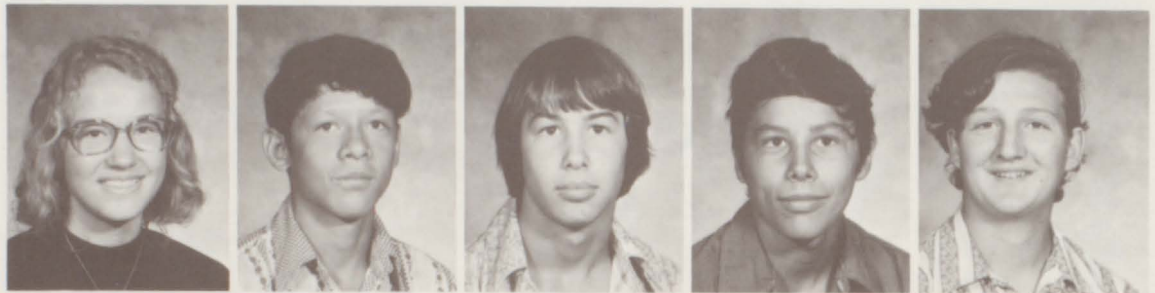


# New Experiences Fill the Sophomore Year

## Seymour High Sends Four to Badger State

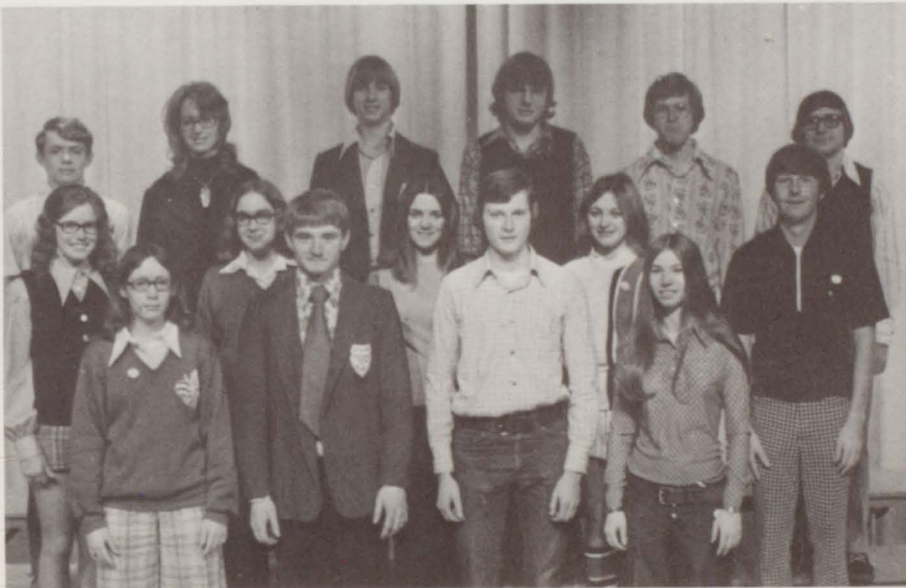

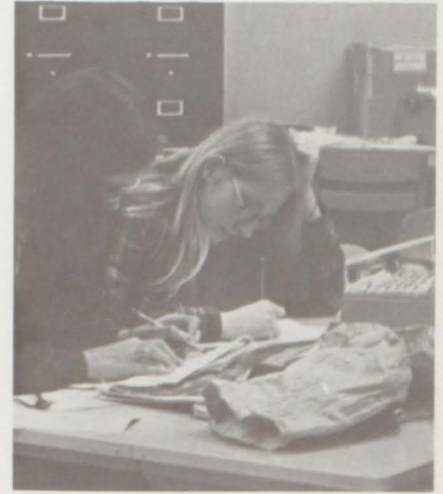

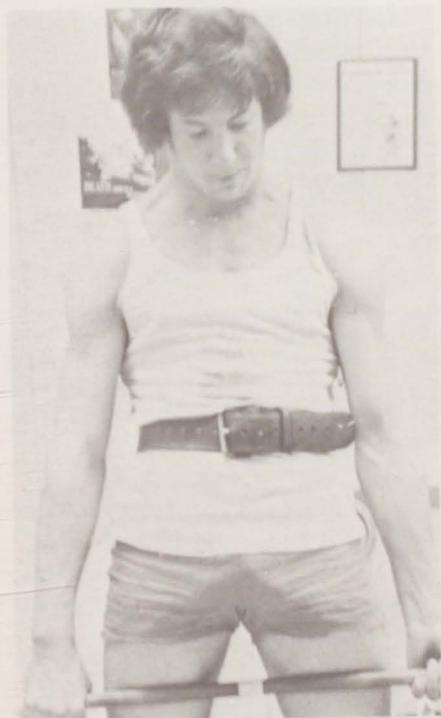

Other events for the year were the Spring Band Concerts on March 5 and also May 30, Solo and Ensemble Festival on April 6, and Band Festival on May 11.



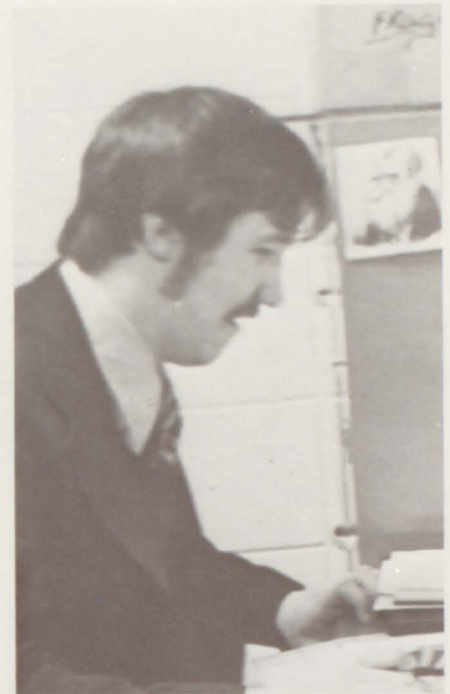

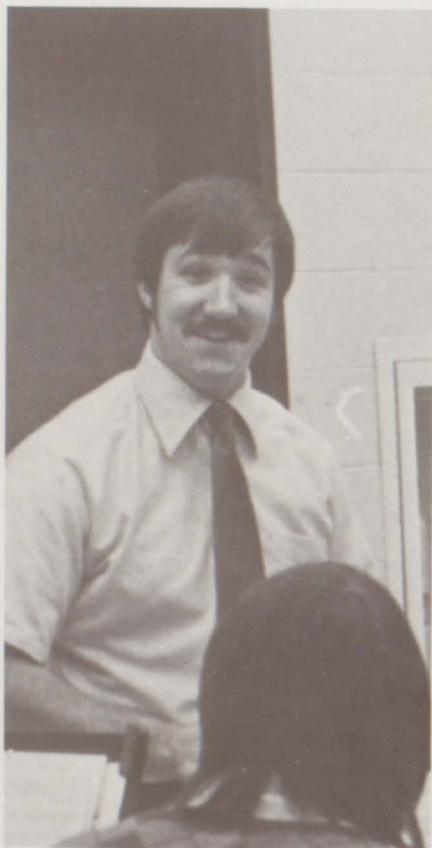
# Jazz Band Makes Key Appearances in Dec.

Again the girls chorus had a large enrollment this year. The girls chorus is made up of freshmen and sophomores. All of the girls strived to achieve their potential.

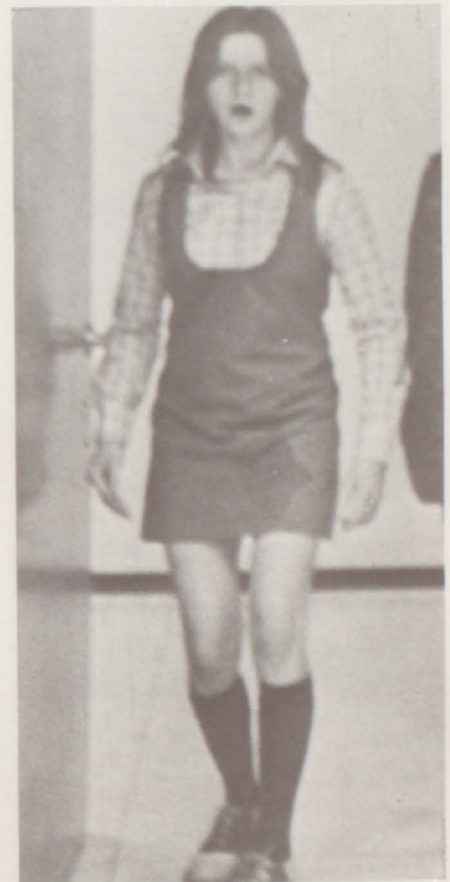

The 1973 track season proved to be satisfying to the majority of the team members. The Indians' record before the state tournament included five victories in the meets to two defeats.

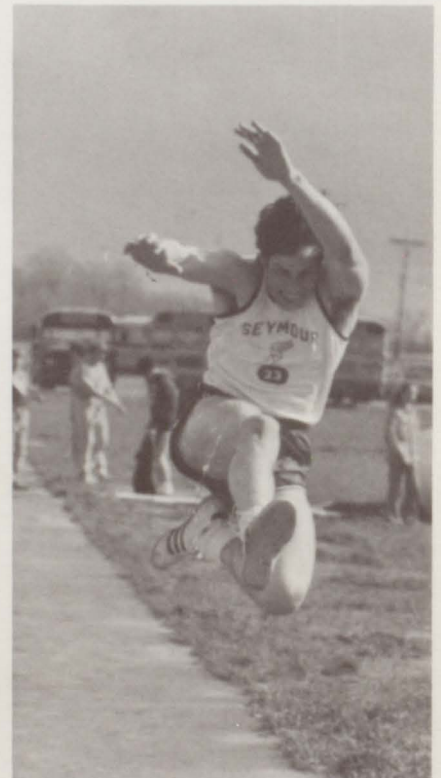
