






Today is the day, Tomorrow is a new day — begin it well and serenely and with high spirit.




























































Stairway to Heaven




A tunnel of love was only the beginning of the many beautiful settings of the Junior Prom on the evening of April 19th.




SEYMOUR TAKES ON CLINTONVILLE

FBLA, Future Business Leaders of America, was led this year by advisor Miss Holmes and President Cheryl Woldt.


One of the major objectives of FBLA is to develop self-confidence and strong, aggressive





French Club is an organization made up of students who have had at least one semester of French. This year the club was led by President Doreen Simon and advisor, Mr. Hoeft.


The club's main event, the Sadie Hawkins dance, was held on February 14. This and other money-raising activities helped finance a trip to a French restaurant.

"The American Dream" was a serious play depicting the American phototype family



This spring the choral group also presented a bicentennial concert for the public.
















OUR TIME


