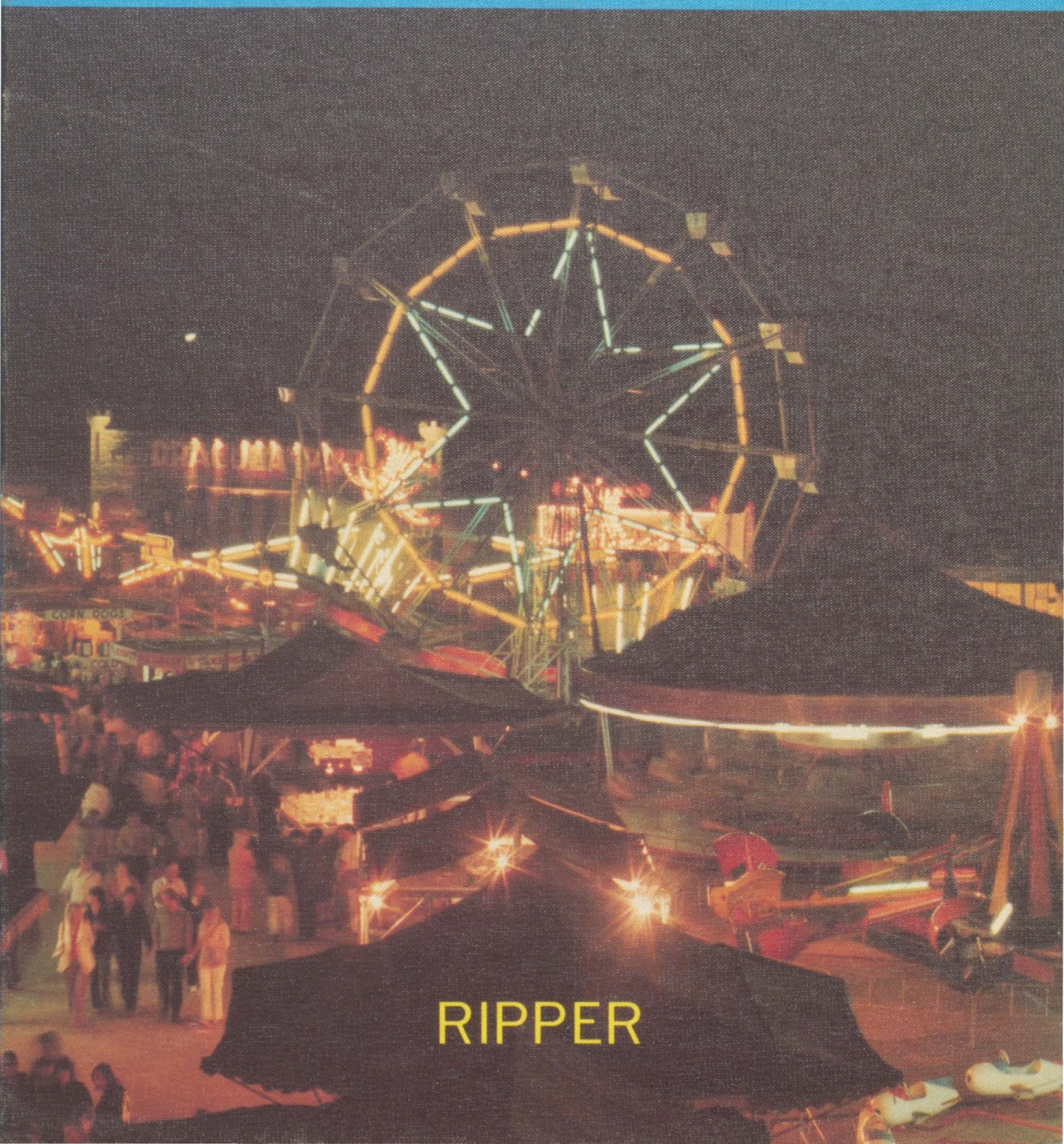

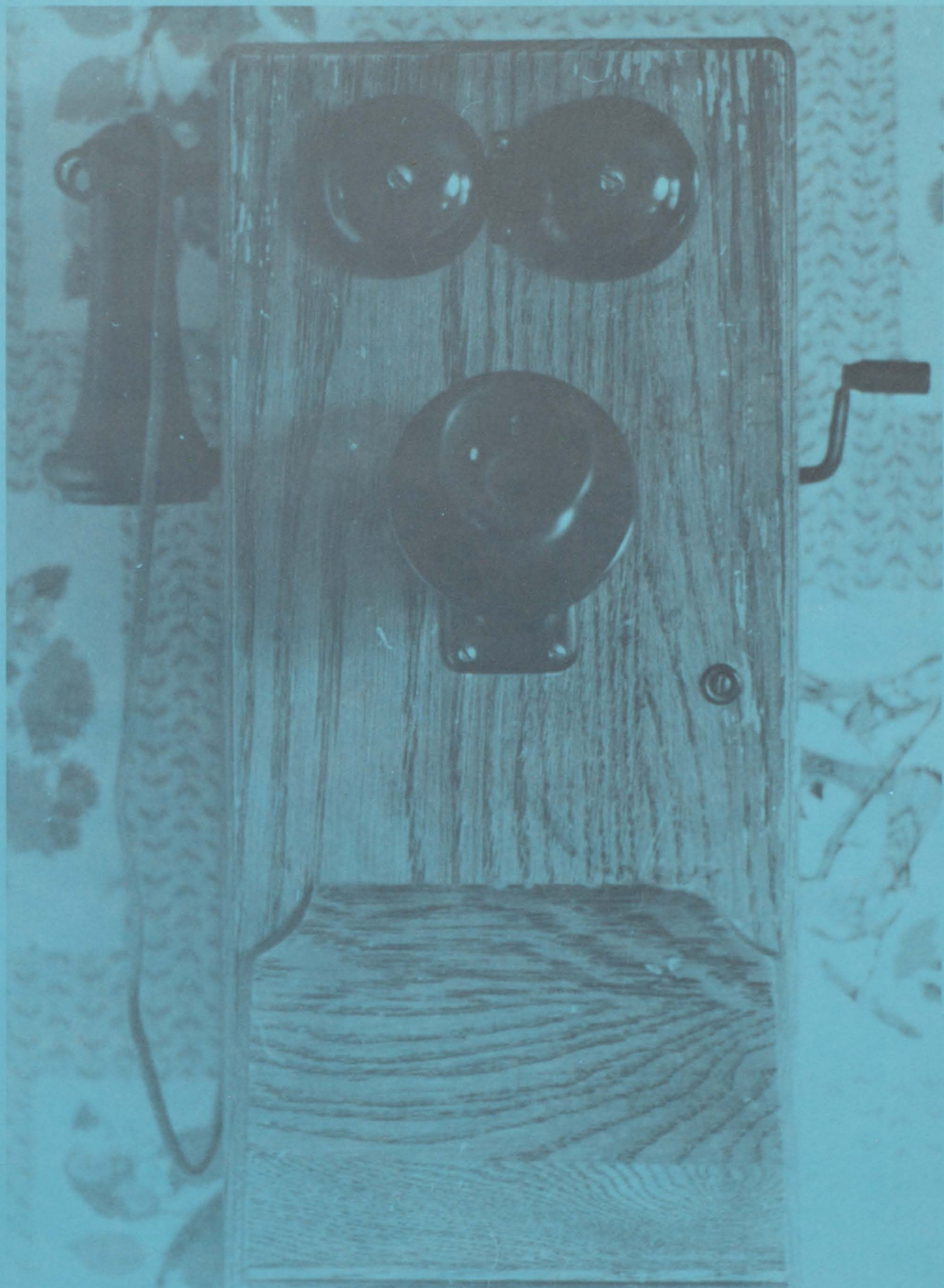


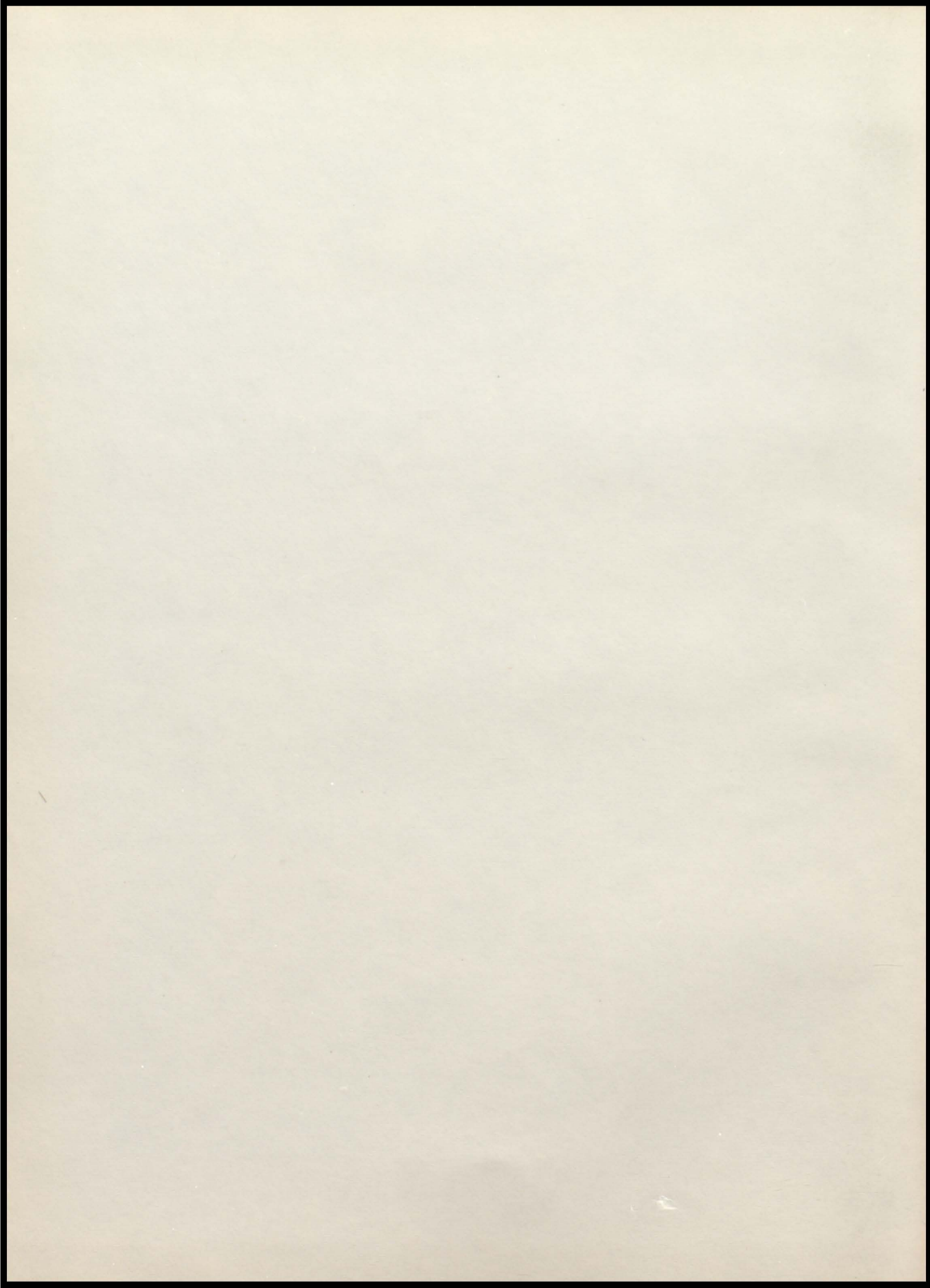

Call up a friend, communicate, show them you care.

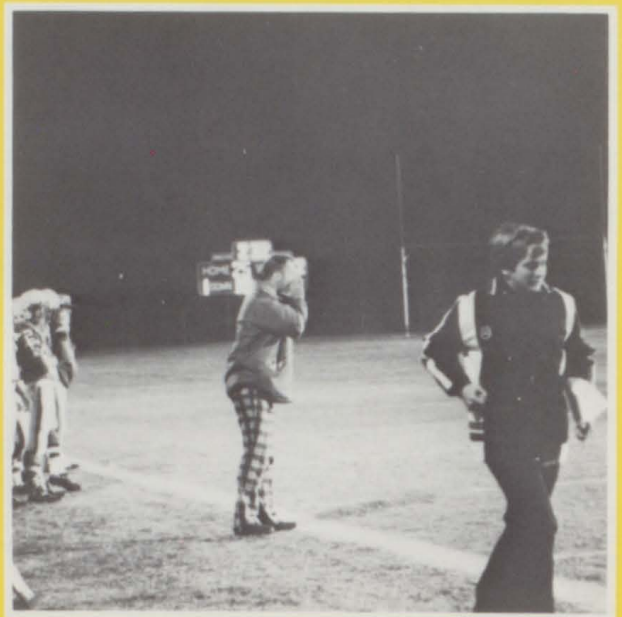

The game was an exciting victory, Seymour 32, Marinette, 12. After the game there was a victory dance with the music provided by Sound Factory.



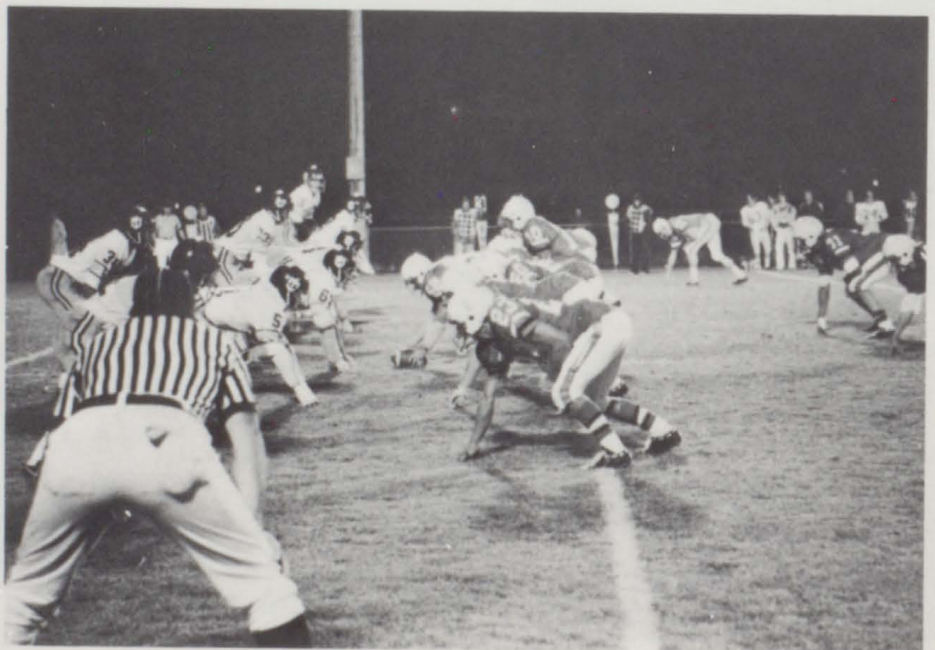

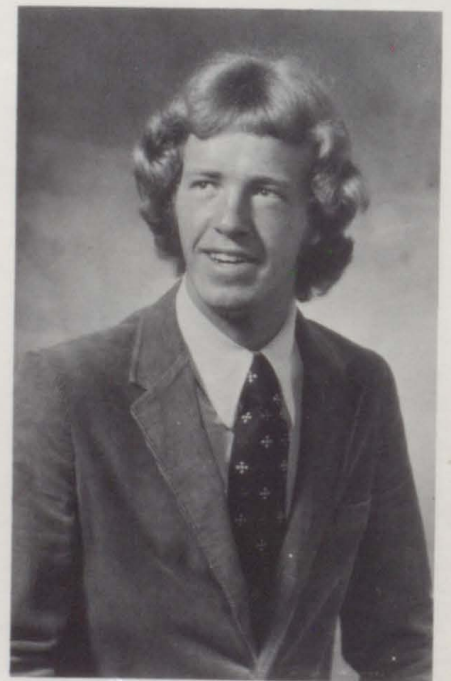
Because of this problem this year's council designed a pattern for future student councils to follow.

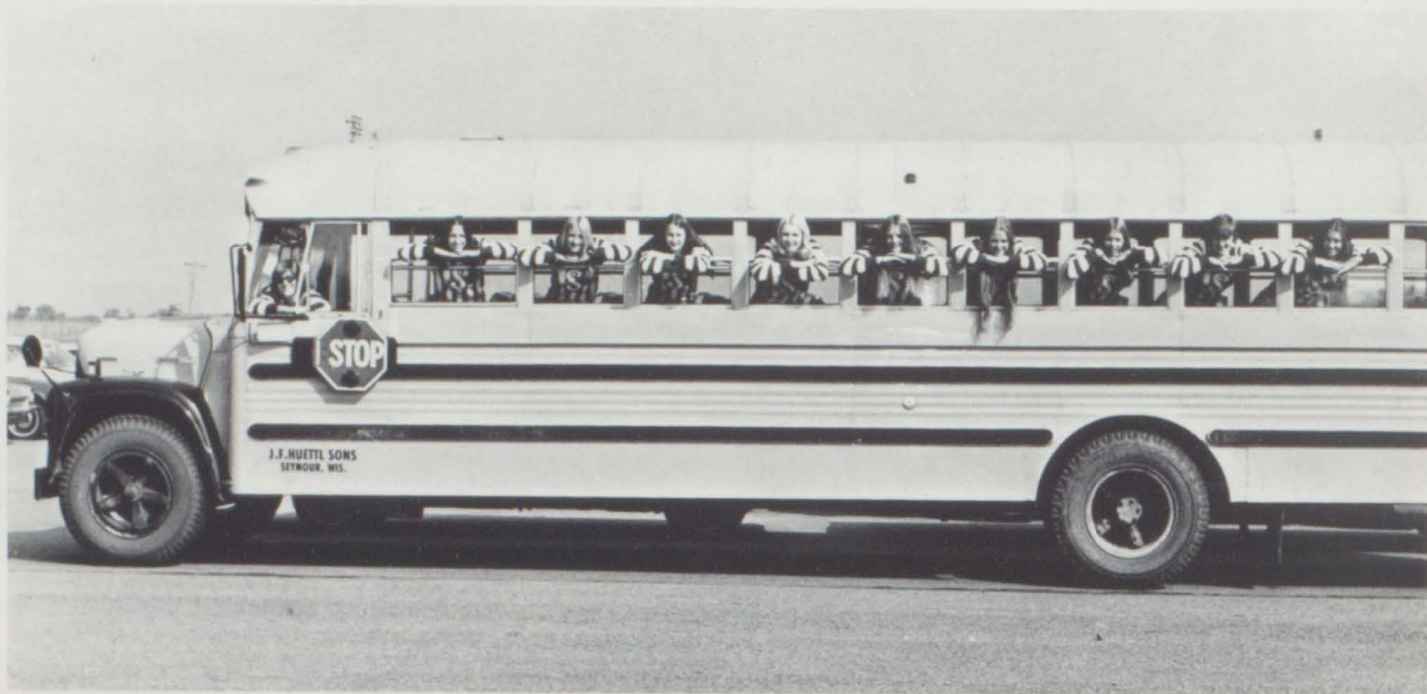

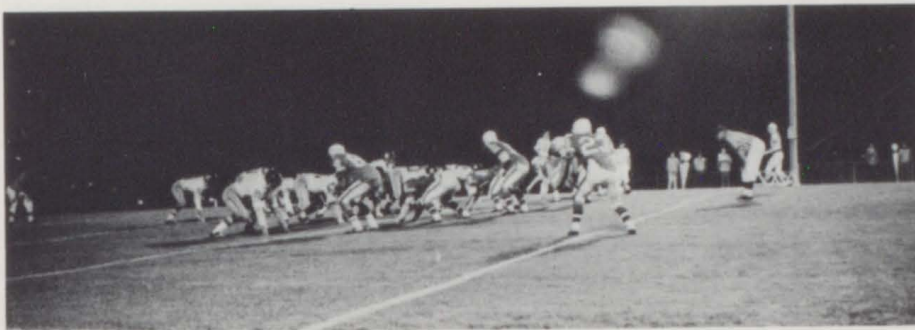

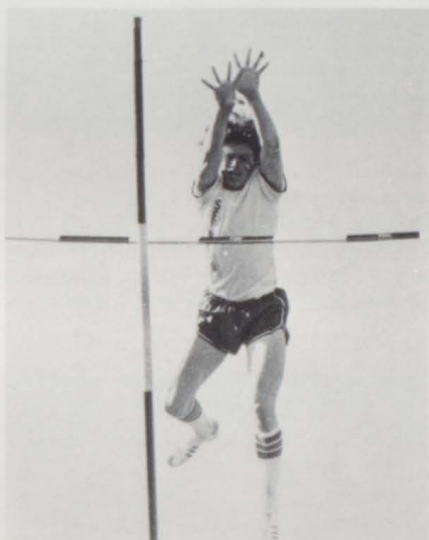
