Seymour Community School District Indian Policies and Procedures

It is the intent of the Seymour Community School District that all Indian children of school age have equal access to all programs, services and activities offered within the school district. To this end, the Seymour Community School District will consult with local tribal officials and parents of Indian children in the planning and development of Indian Policies and Procedures (IPPs), general education programs, and activities. These policies and procedures will be reviewed annually and revisions will be made within 90 days of the determination that requirements are not being adequately met.

ATTESTATIONS

The Seymour Community School District attests that it has established Indian Policies and Procedures (IPPs) as required in section 7004 of the Impact Aid law for any children claimed who reside on eligible Indian lands. The IPPs have been adequately disseminated to the tribes and parents of children residing on eligible Indian lands. A copy of the current policies and procedures is attached to the FY 2022 Impact Aid application.

The Seymour Community School District attests that it has provided a copy of written responses to comments, concerns and recommendations received from tribal leaders and parents of Indian children through the Indian policies and procedures consultation process and disseminated these responses to tribal leaders and parents of Indian children prior to the submission of their FY 2022 Impact Aid application.

INDIAN POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

The following Indian policies and procedures become effective upon school board approval.

- 1. The Seymour Community School District will disseminate relevant applications, evaluations, program plans and information related to the District's education program and activities with sufficient advance notice to allow the tribes and parents of Indian children the opportunity to review and make recommendations. [34CFR222.94(a)(1)]
 - a. The District Administrator/designee will, as soon as reasonably possible after such information becomes available, but not later than one week in advance of any meeting, post the following documents on the District website for all Indian parents and tribal officials to review:
 - i. Impact Aid FY 2022 application;
 - ii. Evaluation of all educational programs assisted with Impact Aid funds; and
 - iii. Plans for education programs assisted with Impact Aid funds that the District intends to initiate or eliminate.

- b. Parents of Indian children, tribal officials and the public will be given notice of any and all meetings related to equal participation or the content of the educational program by including information about meeting times and locations. The location, date and time of any meeting described above shall be posted in the same manner as a legally posted Board meeting.
- c. The Seymour Community School District will disseminate information and seek timely input regarding the following programs on its educational program (including, but not limited to): Title I, Part A, Title I, Part C, Title I, Part D, Title II, Part A, Title III, Part A, Title IV, Part B, Title V, Part B subpart 2, Title VI, Part A, subpart 1, Title VII-Impact Aid programs, Johnson O'Malley programming.
- d. The completed applications, evaluations, and program planning will be made available to parents of Indian children, tribal officials, and the Indian Parent Education Committee and a summary will be prepared and disseminated at least one week in advance of a public hearing held in November to afford all interested parties the opportunity to review the documents with sufficient time to provide thoughtful input at the public meeting. These hearings will be publically advertised by newspaper and website to allow all interested parties to attend. In addition, representatives from the District and Indian Parent Education Committee will schedule meetings with parents to seek input.
- e. Parents of Indian children, tribal officials, the Indian Parent Education Committee and any other interested persons can review assessment data to help develop or modify educational programs and services allowing for the participation of Indian students on an equal basis in the district.
- f. Minutes from these meetings will be posted on the District's website for all patrons and tribal officials to review. This will allow for ongoing dissemination of information.
- 2. The Seymour Community School District will provide an opportunity for the tribes and parents of Indian children to provide their views on the District's educational program and activities, including recommendations on the needs of their children and on how the District may help those children realize the benefits of the educational programs and activities.

 [34CFR222 .94(a)(2)]

As part of this requirement, the Seymour Community School District will:

- a. Notify tribes and the parents of Indian children of the opportunity to submit comments and recommendations, considering the tribe's preference for method of communication, and
- b. Modify the method of and time for soliciting Indian views, if necessary, to ensure the maximum participation of the tribes and parents of Indian children.
 - i. At each monthly school board meeting, a section of time is set aside for communications from the public. This is a time to offer comments and suggestions regarding programming for Indian students.
 - ii. In addition, a public engagement process where family members and tribal leaders are provided the opportunity to provide feedback is scheduled for November of each year. Based upon suggestions, preferred methods of

communication as well as ways to maximize participation from tribal officials and parents of Indian children will be seriously considered.

- 3. The Seymour Community School District will annually assess the extent to which Indian children participate on an equal basis with non-Indian children in the District's education program and activities. As part of this requirement the District will:
 - a. Share relevant information related to Indian children's participation in the District's education program and activities with the tribes and parents of Indian children; and
 - b. Allow tribes and parents of Indian children the opportunity and time to review and comment on whether Indian children participate on an equal basis with non-Indian children. [34CFR222.94(a)(3)]
 - i. The District will take the following measures to annually assess the extent to which Indian children participate on an equal basis with non-Indian children in the District's education program and activities.
 - 1. The Seymour Community School District will monitor Indian student participation in all academic and co-curricular activities.
 - 2. School district officials will review school data to assess the extent of Indian children's participation in the District's educational programs on an equal basis.
 - 3. The Seymour Community School District will share its assessment of district funding, Indian student participation, related academic achievements and other related data with the parents of Indian children and tribal officials by email, posting at tribal offices, and online on the District's website one week in advance of the annual public engagement process meeting scheduled in November of each year.
 - 4. Parents of Indian children, tribal officials and other interested parties may express their views on participation through direct communication with the school district or at any monthly school board meeting, held on the fourth Tuesday of each month.
 - 5. Copies of annual reports will be provided to tribal officials. Parents of Indian children will have at least one week to review information prior to the public engagement process meeting. [34CFR222.94(a)(3)]
- 4. The Seymour Community School District will modify the IPPs if necessary, based upon the results of any assessment or input described in this document. [34CRF222.94(a)(4)]
 - a. During the Indian Parent Education Committee meeting, the Indian Policies and Procedures will be reviewed and revised if necessary. Once this has happened, the document will be forwarded to the Seymour Community School Board as well as the tribal officials and parents of Indian children for review and consideration. If necessary, the Indian Parent Education Committee may suggest revisions at other times of the year as appropriate. Any updates will be sent to parents of Indian children and tribal officials within 30 days of adoption by the Seymour Community School Board.
- 5. The Seymour Community School District will respond at least annually in writing to comments and recommendations made by the tribes or parents of Indian children, and

disseminate the responses to the tribes and parents of Indian children prior to the submission of the IPPs by the LEA. [34CRF222.94(a)(5)]

- a. The Seymour Community School District will at least annually respond in writing to comments and recommendations made by the Indian Parent Education Committee, tribal officials, or parents of Indian children, and disseminate the responses to all parties by email, posting at tribal offices and the Seymour Community School District website prior to the submission of the IPPs by the District.
- 6. The Seymour Community School District will provide a copy of the IPPs annually to the affected tribes. [34CR F222.94 (a)(6)]
 - a. The Seymour Community School District will annually provide a copy of the current Indian Policies and Procedures to the tribes by mail, on the Seymour Community School District website and/or posting at tribal offices.

It is the expectation of the Board that the administration and other District staff members will solicit, welcome, and give due consideration to comments and recommendations received from tribal officials and from the parents and guardians of children from tribal backgrounds regarding (1) District and tribal communication and collaboration; (2) the issues and needs of children from tribal backgrounds; and (3) how the District may help children from tribal backgrounds better realize the benefits of the District's education programs and activities. Further, it is the policy of the Seymour Community School District that children from tribal backgrounds shall have the opportunity to participate on an equal basis with all other District students in the District's education programs and activities.

Federal Impact Aid and Impact Aid Policies and Procedures

In connection with any application for federal Impact Aid payments, and to the extent required under federal law, the District will consult with and involve local tribal officials and parents of American Indian children, at an annual meeting called the second Tuesday in November or at a date mutually agreed upon, in the planning and development of:

- 1. The "Indian Policies and Procedures" (IPPs) that are federally mandated in connection with such applications for federal Impact Aid; and
- 2. The District's general educational program and activities.

The Business Office shall have primary responsibility for monitoring the implementation of the District's IPPs. The Superintendent or designee shall also be responsible for ensuring that the District annually evaluates whether the IPPs are consistent with applicable federal regulations. If the District determines, after input from the tribe(s) and parents of children from tribal backgrounds, that its IPPs do not meet the requirements of the federal regulations, the District shall take prompt action to amend the IPPs to conform to those requirements.

Federal Formula Grants

Applications for federal formula grants for Indian education programs require the District to use a process under which the District meaningfully collaborates with tribes located in the community in a timely, active, and ongoing manner in the development of a comprehensive program and in the actions taken as a result of such collaboration. If the District applies for such a grant, the efforts at consultation and collaboration include:

- 1. Developing the program for which federal assistance is sought in open consultation with stakeholders, including parents of Indian children, teachers, representatives of Indian tribes on specified Indian lands, appropriate tribal organizations, and, if appropriate, Indian students attending high school;
- 2. Developing the applicable program with the participation and approval of a formal stakeholder committee whose composition, procedures, and authority reflect the requirements of applicable federal law; and
- 3. Conducting outreach activities to parents and family members of the children served by the District's program.

The Business Office shall have primary administrative oversight regarding the development, application, and implementation of any program carried out under such a federal formula grant, including ensuring that the required community involvement activities take place.

If the District qualifies as an "affected local education agency" in a particular year (as defined under 20 U.S.C. § 7918), federal law may separately and additionally require the District to consult with applicable tribes prior to the District's submission of a plan or application under a variety of covered federal formula grant programs (generally including various

formula grants established under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, as amended). To the extent required, such consultation shall be structured to provide a timely opportunity for appropriate tribal officials to meaningfully and substantively contribute to the plans or applications under the covered federal programs, particularly as to issues affecting American Indian students.

Recordkeeping

The Business Office shall ensure that the District maintains appropriate documentation of its consultative, collaborative, and related activities under this policy and, to the extent applicable, under the District's IPPs.

The Seymour Community School District will disseminate information and seek timely input regarding the following programs on its educational program (including, but not limited to): Title I, Part A, Title I, Part C, Title I, Part D, Title II, Part A, Title III, Part A, Title IV, Part A, Title IV, Part B, Title V, Part B subpart 2, Title VI, Part A, subpart 1, Title VII-Impact Aid programs, Jonson O'Malley programming.
- d. The completed applications, evaluations, and program planning will be made available to parents of Indian children, tribal officials, and the Indian Education Committee and a summary will be prepared and disseminated at least one week in advance of a public hearing held in November to afford all interested parties the opportunity to review the documents with sufficient time to provide thoughtful input at the public meeting. These hearings will be publicly advertised by newspaper and website to allow all interested parties to attend. In addition, representatives from the District and Indian Education Committee will schedule meetings with parents to seek input.
- e. Parents of Indian children, tribal officials, the Indian Education Committee and any other interested persons can review assessment data to help develop or modify educational programs and services allowing for the participation of Indian students on an equal basis in the district.
- f. Minutes from these meetings will be posted on the District's website for all patrons and tribal officials to review. This will allow for ongoing dissemination of information.
- 2. a. The Seymour Community School District will provide an opportunity for the Oneida Tribe and parents of Native American children to provide their views on the District's educational program and activities, including recommendations on the needs of their children and on how the District may help those children realize the benefits of the educational programs and activities. [34CFR222 .94(a)(2)]

As part of this requirement, the Seymour Community School District will:

- a. Notify the Oneida Nation and the parents of Native American children of the opportunity to submit comments and recommendations, considering the Oneida Nation's preference for method of communication, and
- b. Modify the method of and time for soliciting Native American views, if necessary, to ensure the maximum participation of the Oneida Nation and parents of Native American children.
 - i. At each monthly school board meeting, a section of time is set aside for communications from the public. This is a time to offer comments and suggestions regarding programming for Indian students.
 - ii. In addition, a public engagement process where family members and Oneida Nation leaders are provided the opportunity to provide feedback is scheduled for November of each year. Based upon suggestions, preferred methods of communication as well as ways to maximize participation from tribal officials and parents of Indian children will be seriously considered.
- 3. The Seymour Community School District will annually assess the extent to which Indian children participate on an equal basis with non-Indian children in the District's education program and activities. As part of this requirement the District will:
 - a. Share relevant information related to Indian children's participation in the District's education program and activities with the tribes and parents of Indian children; and
 - b. Allow tribes and parents of Indian children the opportunity and time to review and comment on whether Indian children participate on an equal basis with non-Indian children. [34CFR222.94(a)(3)]
 - The District will take the following measures to annually assess the extent to which Indian children participate on an equal basis with non-Indian children in the District's education program and activities.
 - 1. The Seymour Community School District will monitor Indian student participation in all academic and co-curricular activities.
 - 2. School district officials will review school data to assess the extent of Indian children's participation in the District's educational programs on an equal basis.
 - 3. The Seymour Community School District will share its assessment of district funding, Indian student participation, related academic achievements and other related data with the parents of Indian children and tribal officials by email, posting at tribal offices, and online on the District's website one week in advance of the annual public engagement process meeting scheduled in November of each year.
 - 4. Parents of Indian children, tribal officials and other interested parties may express their views on participation through direct communication with the school district or at any school board

meeting.

- 5. Copies of annual reports will be provided to tribal officials. Parents of Indian children will have at least one week to review information prior to the public engagement process meeting. [34CFR222.94(a)(3)]
- 4. The Seymour Community School District will modify the IPPs if necessary, based upon the results of any assessment or input described in this document. [34CRF222.94(a)(4)]
 - a. During the Indian Education Committee meeting, the Indian Policies and Procedures will be reviewed and revised if necessary. Once this has happened, the document will be forwarded to the Seymour Community School Board as well as the tribal officials and parents of Indian children for review and consideration. If necessary, the Indian Education Committee may suggest revisions at other times of the year as appropriate. Any updates will be sent to parents of Indian children and tribal officials within 30 days of adoption by the Seymour Community School Board.
- 5. The Seymour Community School District will respond at least annually in writing to comments and recommendations made by the tribes or parents of Indian children, and disseminate the responses to the tribes and parents of Indian children prior to the submission of the IPPs by the LEA. [34CRF222 .94(a)(5)]
 - a. The Seymour Community School District will at least annually respond in writing to comments and recommendations made by the Indian Parent Committee, tribal officials, or parents of Indian children, and disseminate the responses to all parties by email, posting at tribal offices and the Seymour Community School District website prior to the submission of the IPPs by the District.
- 6. The Seymour Community School District will provide a copy of the IPPs annually to the affected tribes. [34CR F222.94 (a)(6)]
 - a. The Seymour Community School District will annually provide a copy of the current Indian Policies and Procedures to the tribes by mail, on the Seymour Community School District website and/or posting at tribal offices.

Board Policy 187 - Public Participation

The Board desires citizens of the District to attend its sessions so that they may become better acquainted with the operation and programs of the schools, and that the Board may have opportunity to hear the wishes and ideas of the public. Wisconsin Statutes and court cases prohibit Board Members from discussing or acting on issues that have not been legally placed on the agenda. In addition, the Board reserves the right to meet privately for work sessions and to adjourn or recess a meeting at any time to discuss such matters as are properly considered in executive session.

On every regular Board Agenda visitors will be recognized as part of the agenda. In order to assure that persons who wish to appear before the Board may be heard and, at the same time, conduct its meetings properly and efficiently, the Board adopts the following guidelines pertaining to public participation at Board meetings:

- 1. In accordance with the Wisconsin Open Meetings Law, the Board cannot take action on any item not published on the agenda. Items of concern or public questions shall be referred to the appropriate Board Committee or Administrator. The Board may place issues of concern on future Board Agendas.
- 2. Any individual desiring to speak shall complete sign-up sheet 187_E and submit to the Board President prior to the start of the meeting.
- 3. The presentation should be as brief as possible. Unless an extension of time is granted, a speaker shall be limited to three minutes. Each speaker will be allowed to speak once to an issue. Exceptions to this rule may be granted by majority vote of the Board.
- 4. Speakers may offer such objective criticisms of school operations and programs as concern them. But in public session, the Board will not hear personal complaints of school personnel nor against any person connected with the school system. Other channels provide for Board consideration and disposition of legitimate complaints involving individuals.

The Board vests in its president or other presiding officer authority to terminate the remarks of any individual when they do not adhere to the rules established above.

Persons appearing before the Board are reminded, as a point of information, which members of the Board are without authority to act independently as individuals in official matters. Thus, questions may be directed to individual Board members, but answers must be deferred pending consideration by the full Board

Board Policy 187 - Public Participation

The Board desires citizens of the District to attend its sessions so that they may become better acquainted with the operation and programs of the schools, and that the Board may have opportunity to hear the wishes and ideas of the public. Wisconsin Statutes and court cases prohibit Board Members from discussing or acting on issues that have not been legally placed on the agenda. In addition, the Board reserves the right to meet privately for work sessions and to adjourn or recess a meeting at any time to discuss such matters as are properly considered in executive session.

On every regular Board Agenda visitors will be recognized as part of the agenda. In order to assure that persons who wish to appear before the Board may be heard and, at the same time, conduct its meetings properly and efficiently, the Board adopts the following guidelines pertaining to public participation at Board meetings:

- 1. In accordance with the Wisconsin Open Meetings Law, the Board cannot take action on any item not published on the agenda. Items of concern or public questions shall be referred to the appropriate Board Committee or Administrator. The Board may place issues of concern on future Board Agendas.

- 1. Next Generation Science Storylines = Carrie Schmidt, Seymour High School science teacher, presented about a new curriculum being used in High School Biology. The new curriculum shifts to a 3-dimensional classroom which is focusing on science and engineering practices, crosscutting concepts (Science literacy, analyzing, etc) and disciplinary core ideas, which is what NGSS (Next Generation Science Standards) is meant to do. The Storylines curriculum focuses on "more figuring out, less learning about" for students to become self-directed problem solvers. The curriculum was piloted second semester during the 2019-20 school year. See attached presentation for more details.
- 2. Seymour High School Block Schedule = Tom Mueller and Jen Aspenson shared information about the new block schedule at the high school, which is currently going well. Within the block schedule, students have three or four 90 minute classes per day with changing classes every nine weeks. The high school leadership team is now talking about the future of block scheduling for the next school year gathering pros and cons about this type of scheduling. They will also be surveying staff, parents and students regarding the block schedule prior to making a decision for next school year. We will share updates in a future meeting.
- 3. AP (Advanced Placement) classes= Curt Jefson and Chelsey Schaumberg. presented about AP classes. Seymour High School is currently offering seven AP classes. Chelsey started teaching AP European History last school year. She shared that students are enjoying being able to earn college credit and application of the content to other disciplines. Curt has been teaching AP Psychology for 20 years. Curt shared that AP Human Geography is a new offering targeting freshman to begin taking AP classes. Curt shared the modifications to the AP tests from last year due to the school closure. He also shared some of the resources that he uses in his AP class. Tom Mueller shared the "AP Enrollment History" for the last three years, which has increased from 107 students to 179 students taking AP classes (see attached for more details).

Board Policy 187 - Public Participation

The Board desires citizens of the District to attend its sessions so that they may become better acquainted with the operation and programs of the schools, and that the Board may have opportunity to hear the wishes and ideas of the public. Wisconsin Statutes and court cases prohibit Board Members from discussing or acting on issues that have not been legally placed on the agenda. In addition, the Board reserves the right to meet privately for work sessions and to adjourn or recess a meeting at any time to discuss such matters as are properly considered in executive session.

On every regular Board Agenda visitors will be recognized as part of the agenda. In order to assure that persons who wish to appear before the Board may be heard and, at the same time, conduct its meetings properly and efficiently, the Board adopts the following guidelines pertaining to public participation at Board meetings:

- 1. In accordance with the Wisconsin Open Meetings Law, the Board cannot take action on any item not published on the agenda. Items of concern or public questions shall be referred to the appropriate Board Committee or Administrator. The Board may place issues of concern on future Board Agendas.
- 2. Any individual desiring to speak shall complete sign-up sheet 187_E and submit to the Board President prior to the start of the meeting.
- 3. The presentation should be as brief as possible. Unless an extension of time is granted, a speaker shall be limited to three minutes. Each speaker will be allowed to speak once to an issue. Exceptions to this rule may be granted by majority vote of the Board.
- 4. Speakers may offer such objective criticisms of school operations and programs as concern them. But in public session, the Board will not hear personal complaints of school personnel nor against any person connected with the school system. Other channels provide for Board consideration and disposition of legitimate complaints involving individuals.

The Board vests in its president or other presiding officer authority to terminate the remarks of any individual when they do not adhere to the rules established above.

Persons appearing before the Board are reminded, as a point of information, which members of the Board are without authority to act independently as individuals in official matters. Thus, questions may be directed to individual Board members, but answers must be deferred pending consideration by the full Board
