McKinney-Vento Program

**Support for families experiencing
homelessness**



Who is eligible?

The McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act defines people experiencing homelessness as individuals who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence, such as living:

- ◆ In an emergency or transitional shelter with friends or family due to loss of housing or hardship (double up)
- ◆ In a motel, hotel or campground
- ◆ In a car, bus or other public place
- ◆ In an abandoned building or some other inadequate accommodations
- ◆ A youth not living with a parent or legal guardian and staying with others temporarily, including runaway
- ◆ A child of a migrant worker

Student Rights

Immediate School Enrollment

Even without proof of residency, guardianship, immunizations, or school records.

School Choice

Students may choose to stay at the school attended when permanently housed or to enroll in the school where currently living for the remainder of the academic year.

Free Breakfast and Lunch

Students are automatically eligible to receive free meals for the remainder of the school year

School Fee Waivers

Students have the right to equal access to education and full participation.

Transportation

Transportation is provided for students residing outside of their school's attendance area.



Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction and Seymour Community School District share the vision that all students experiencing homelessness are provided the opportunity and supports needed to achieve their goals and own their future .

Did you know?

- This Act is a part of the No Child Left Behind Federal Legislation which protects homeless students from discrimination and mandates equal access to educational programs and services. Students who are identified as homeless must have barriers to their education removed.
- Every school district must designate a homeless liaison to help students and their families who lack housing
- Once stable housing is acquired, families are still eligible for services for the remaining of the school year
