Students and their families have prepared for high school graduation for many years. The following guidelines have been established so students in the Class of 2013 may be recognized with dignity and respect.

- All 2013 graduates are to attend graduation practice on Friday, May 31, at 10:00 a.m. in the field house. A picnic for the graduates will follow practice.
- The recommended dress code for graduates is: For male graduates: dress pants, shirt and tie, and dress shoes. For female graduates: appropriate dresses or dress pants and shirt, and dress shoes.
- So families and friends can enjoy the ceremony with minimal distraction, a professional photograph of individual students receiving their diploma will be available to each graduate.
- Guests will be admitted to the field house by ticket only. Each graduate will receive 10 tickets for family and friends. If unused tickets are available, they will be distributed to graduates who register a need in the student services office prior to graduation practice.
- Graduates are expected to obey and respect all school rules. Violations of school rules may result in exclusion from the commencement ceremony and may require graduates to pick up their diploma from school officials at a designated meeting.

Local Student Nominated To Compete In National Award Program

Christopher Kollath, a Seymour Community High School senior has been nominated to compete in the national 2012-13 Herff Jones Believe in You Scholarship & Principal's Award.

Michael Flaherty, Principal, Seymour Community High School, announced the nomination, which places Christopher in the national competition. Chris now has the opportunity to compete for a \$2,000, \$5,000, \$8,500 or \$12,000 scholarship.



Participating high school principals (from across the country) could nominate one senior high student to compete in this year's program. Winners are recognized for exemplary leadership qualities and academic success.

Extended School Days Due to Snow Days and Weather Delays

The Seymour Community School District will add 6 minutes at the end of each school day beginning Wednesday, May 8 to make up for lost instructional time due to weather closures and late starts.

District Administrator Peter Ross said the district is short about 150 minutes as required by state Department of Public Instruction rules governing days and minutes of instruction.

"In lieu of adding a partial day, we will be adding six minutes to the end of each instructional day starting

Wednesday, May 8, through the end of the school year," Ross said. "Dismissal on the last day, June 7, will be at 2 p.m. This action will bring us to the required number of minutes."

How to be safe when schools out for Summer!



1) Swimming is the most popular summer activity. The best thing you can do to help your family stay safe this summer is to enroll in age-appropriate swim lessons. Do not go near water if you are not able to swim. Life Vests are a simple way to prevent deaths from drowning. Vests save Lives!



2) Protect Yourself from the Sun! Wear sunscreen at all times. The sun emits harmful ultraviolent rays. To prevent skin damage or skin cancer wear sunscreen with SPF of 30. Wear sun hats to cover exposed areas of the face. A TIP is to wear SPF lip protection, such as SPF chapstick. Lips are a common skin cancer location. Don't for get your eyes! UV rays can cause eye damage so use ultraviolet lenses for your sunglasses. Protection is KEY!



3) WATER WATER! Don't leave the house without bringing a bottle of water with you. In warm temperatures our body's need extra water. Thirst and dry mouth are early signs of dehydration.



4) BUG PROTECTION: Mosquitos, ticks, and bees are very common for our area this time of the year, with the potential of carrying harmful disease. Before outside activities apply bug repellant. If playing in wooden or high grass areas wear socks, long pants, and sleeves especially in the morning and at dusk. Avoid areas with standing water. This provides a defense in case you encounter these pests. West Nile Virus- can come from mosquitoes, and Lyme's disease from ticks.



5) Protect your Brain-Wear A HELMET! When rollerblading, biking, skateboarding, or scooter riding ALWAYS wear your helmet! This can be an EASY thing to prevent brain injury if you're involved in any accidents.



6) **KEEP cold food cold and hot food hot!** Food borne illnesses increase in the summer because bacteria grow faster in warmer temperatures and humidity. More people are eating and preparing food outdoors at picnics and barbecues, where *refrigeration* and places to wash hands are not readily available. **Food is considered contaminated when left unrefrigerated for more than 2 hours.** For More Tips: Visit the American Red Cross.org & http://life.familyeducation.com
