The questions are: how to you cite and punctuate various passages?

CITATIONS

 ONLY the author's last name and page # go in the () citation.

● (Orwell 23).

HOW TO HANDLE END PUNCTUATION OF QUOTED MATERIAL

• If the quoted material ENDS in a period, do NOT put a period before the end of the quote.

"I will work harder" (Orwell 50).

• If the quoted material ends w/ a! Or? You DO put the! OR? at the end of the quote

"Comrades are birds our enemies or friends?" (Orwell 23).

MOST OF THE TIME YOU JUST USE REGULAR QUOTES "" ""

 If you take a passage word for word from the text even if it wasn't in quotes, then you need " "

If you are quoting a passage that was in quotes, you use regular quotes " "

"I will work harder" (Orwell 50).

CHALLENGE ZONE:

IF you have quotes inside of quotes,

- the inside set is single quotes 'I love you' and
- the rest of the passage would be in regular quotes. "

EXAMPLE: "She screamed at Reverend Taylor.

'Preach it. I say, preach it'" (Angelou 39).

- From our prior example we know that even if a passage was in quotes in the primary text, we still just use regular quotes.
- "I will work harder" (Orwell 12).
- So when do we use singular quotes?

(We'll practice together on the next slide.)
