Free & Reduced Lunch

Applying for Free and Reduced lunch can help your child in many ways!!

We understand that not all students eat lunch or breakfast at school but filling out the forms can help in a variety of other ways. Here are some examples:

Free AP testing, Saturday ACT tests, college application fees and sometimes enrollment/housing deposits, etc...

Schools can use this information to determine who to nominate for some scholarships that are specifically for families with low income.

DPI has scholarships that can be used for summer pre-college programs and tuition scholarships for the senior speech class or pre-calculus or calculus through UWO.
